Never Stop Reading

We recently received these Never Stop Reading bookmarks from the Department of Education. They are promoting a new initiative encouraging parents of children from years 3 to 6 to continue reading aloud to their children as they progress through primary school. Research indicates there are significant positive effects of read aloud interventions on children's learning outcomes and social and emotional development, particularly for children at risk of reading difficulties. Parent Education

I have been really keen to share some knowledge about the way students learn and why we teach the way we do. This Friday at 2pm in the library before BEARS club, we will have our first coffee and cake as I share with you one aspect of teaching children English. I am going to share parts of the Professional Learning that Mrs Goforth and I participated in last week that is going to be implemented through the school and form a large component of our School Operational Plan. Please come along to support us to support you and your child.

NAPLAN ONLINE

After many years of planning today was the first day of NAPLAN online for everybody nationally. Today our first



NAPLAN online session was the writing. The students had been completing practise sessions with Mrs Chapman in class. The year 3 students completed the writing task with pen and paper but the year 5 cohort completed the writing on-line. The writing stimulus was interesting and the students all wrote using the time limit. Tomorrow we have reading, Wednesday is Language Conventions and Friday is Numeracy.

RESILIENCE

At school we are focussing on being resilient and responsible for your own actions. Being resilient can mean standing up to someone and saying no when they are doing inappropriate actions or using inappropriate speech. We are using the poster below to encourage children what they can do when they are in an unpleasant situation. We have also made posters for the buses so that students know they can use the same language on the bus.

I Am Assertive

When Someone is Being Mean

1.Stop that please,

(I don't like it, it's mean, etc)

2.If they do it again, Stop it or I'll tell the teacher.

3.If they do it again, **Tell**





One of our targets in our Business Plan in our priority of "A Positive Learning Environment' is to maintain or improve the school attendance rate so that 90% or more of our students attend school for at least 90% of the time. For the first fortnight of this term our whole school attendance is 94.43%. 22 of our students have attended 100% of the time in the first 2 weeks of term. Keep up the great week. At BEARS club each week we give out an attendance award. Tokens are given out to students who attend the 5 days of school that week and then one token is chosen for a pick out of the prize box.

School Board Nominations

Two parent member positions are available on our School Board. Another two will be coming up for election in December 2018. Parent members have a maximum term length of 3 years. If you are interested but the timing is not quite right for you, it is worth noting that two more positions will be coming up for election in December 2018. If you are interested in learning more or nominating, please contact myself. The board meets 4-5 times per year. The meetings are typically on a Thursday evening from 5-7pm so that we cater for working parents. Minutes, agendas and any reports are sent out well in advance so that meeting time is well utilised. Parent members are required to read any reports available prior to the meeting and bring their considered opinions to the table. In essence, the role of school board is one of setting the long term future for the school and maintaining oversight (not management) of the school's operation. It is not about running the school – that is the job of the principal. It is about providing additional expertise to help the school achieve the best outcomes for the students. Some of the matters councils/boards may make decisions on include fees and charges, book lists, sponsorship and dress codes. We regularly review the business plan targets, budget and school surveys. We are consistently looking at ways to promote the school, encouraging more student numbers. The Principal seeks the advice of councils/boards so as to understand local community views. 


