### Professional Learning –WAPPA Conference

It is a requirement from the Teacher Registration Board that a teacher completes sufficient professional learning to maintain currency of their professional competence. Last week I was fortunate to attend the annual West Australian Primary Principals Association conference. The theme was Effective Teams, Effective Schools. This resonated well with me as my priorities have always been communication is what influences good teams and assists to be effective in terms of success we can build for our students. I was totally inspired by many of the speakers who managed to link all their keynote addresses together. My favourite would have been **Dr Simon Breakspear**, who is an educator and parent. He spoke about 'Teaching Sprints'. His simple message is **plan** to teach a focus skill, sprint over a short time activities to **teach** the plan and then **review** the progress made by the students. Yes, I can hear you saying isn't that a teachers job? However in our crowded curriculum nowadays we often loose sight of the progress of students in a particular focussed area. We often have so many interruptions that our focus gets some what diluted. In this teaching sprint you maintain focus for that period of time and typically it would be a literacy or numeracy component. I also enjoyed listening to **Dr Adam Fraser** talk about how important recovery is in order to make progress or succeed and his idea of 'The Third Space'. I was so motivated by his presentations I purchased his book. His idea of using life's little transitions to find balance and happiness. SO his idea is represented in the diagram, but a simple way to explain it is the difference between what happens at work then how do you get ready to get home and still be happy and balanced and be "KIND" to your family. I would love to share my book and chat about this whole concept, so if you have time come and grab a cuppa with me and chat. All in all WAPPA was a very positive experience in 2019 and I look forward to implementing some of the Effective Team messages I came home with.

## COMMUNICATION with PARENTS



## Health and Wellbeing Focus 2019

### ZONES OF REGULATION

As part of our Health and Wellbeing Focus for 2019, we have been using the Zones of Regulation program. Zones of Regulation is a curriculum designed to foster self-regulation and emotional control. Last week the senior class did a Literacy integrated activity using Zones of Regulations and Idioms. The children are practising different calming techniques to use when under stress.



## ATTENDANCE

One of our targets in our Business Plan in our priority of "A Positive Learning Environment" is to maintain or improve the school attendance rate so that 90% or more of our students attend school for at least 90% of the time. **For weeks 3-5 of Term three** our whole school attendance is **90%**. 20 students have 90% or better than attendance. However if your child is unwell and is not at school please notify the office of any absences. The students do get an extra raindrop for Kindness when they attend 5 days of school in the week.
