

NABAWA REFUSE SITE

Location: Nabawa Yetna Road. Access is available from both Chapman Valley Road and Nanson Howatharra Road.

Opening Hours: Wednesdays & Sundays, 8.30am to 4.30pm.

Residents are required to provide a copy of their Shire Access Card (if requested) when they dispose of their rubbish if they are to avoid any charges being imposed or access to the site being denied.

Refuse Site Charges are applicable to those unable to produce a Shire Access Card.

Rubbish is to be dumped in the appropriately signed areas for the rubbish type.

Prohibited

~ Disposal of waste oil, grease, hydraulic fluids, etc. Such items are to be disposed of at the Meru Refuse Site. Contact Wren Oil directly for waste oil disposal.

~ Chemical Containers, tyres, gas bottles, combustible fuel containers, liquid waste, asbestos is prohibited. Illegal dumping will result in prosecution.

Dumping of large quantities (3 cubic meters or greater) of rubbish or building materials requires prior authorisation from the Shire CEO. Fees may be imposed.

CCTV is in place at the refuse site.

REFUSE COLLECTION RATES

Section 67 of the Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery (WARR) Act 2007 provides for a local government to arrange for the proper disposal of waste, by making an annual charge per waste receptacle.

All ratepayers in a GRV category (Townsite) must contribute to the waste management budget once there is an improvement on the property (vacant land do not pay rubbish charges) whether they utilise the service or not.

All Ratepayers in the UV (rural) category have a choice of utilising the service. If the contractor is going past their property, then a service can be added.

Council's existing contract for the past seven (7) years with Toxfree/Cleanaway has recently expired, with Council recently going out to tender for a new contract service.

Unfortunately, due to a number of economic pressures out of Council's control, this price has significantly increased resulting in an increase in the annual charge.

Council simply recoups the exact rate imposed by the contractor. Council cannot add additional cost to refuse collection fees. We apologise for the increase, but it was unfortunately 'out of our hands'. It is expected that rates will stay at close to this rate for the next five (5) years.

Rates have also significantly increased for Irwin, CGG & Northampton with Council working hard to keep rates comparable.
